September 10, 2015

Meeting called to order by our president Nancy Redman at 6:13 p.m.

Jeff and Jerry attended the meeting to share information concerning the YNs. Jerry thanked the board for the money that has been given to the YNs. Jerry turned in the receipts for all expenditures. Tim will review the receipts. They will present a list of needs after the first of the year for the 2016 expenditures.

Jim Carman made a motion to pay for a room Saturday evening for the YN educators during the October Coin Show. Judy has priced a room at Drury Inn for around \$100.00 plus tax. Bob Nicholson seconded the motion for the educators to stay at Drury Inn. The motion carried.

Jim Carman has brought forward a problem with the table fees for the Coin Show. He would like to eliminate option 2. This allows the dealers to obtain a table at the early bird price if the dealer signs up prior to November 30. This has caused problems with obtaining the appropriate fees. Nancy made a motion to eliminate option 2. Bob seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Nancy informed the board that Midwest Security will provide security at the coin show.

We will prepare the elongated pennies at the Discovery Center prior to the show instead of taking the penny smasher to the show.

Jim Carman suggested we change the price of the tables for the coin show. Board members will receive a free second table. Jim would like to absorb the temporary city license into the table fee. Jim's final request is to consider reducing the price of the second table which he feels will result in more tables being sold. We would price the second table for the early bird registrations at \$50. For registration at a later date the second table will be \$60. Tim made a motion to accept Jim's entire request. Bob Nicholson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ed made a motion we charge \$5 for t-shirts, \$10 for polo, long sleeve T's and sweat shirts and \$15 for hoodies. There will be an additional \$1 per X for shirts starting at XXL. Club members will need to prepay for their garments. This will be our last planned order for several years. Jim Carman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Tiny attended the meeting and discussed inviting "King" George Wyant from the National Geographic show "Diggers" to our coin show. After lots of discussion Tiny will assure George has an appropriate agenda. Ed made a motion that we give George a free table and \$350.00 for expenses. Jim Carman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ed Mayer and Jim Carman reviewed the bank statement and approved all transactions.

September: Truman Carter Account: beginning balance \$12,359.69; Transfer to General Account \$4,000.00; Annual Carter Funds Released \$0.00; interest \$0.10; ending balance \$8,359.79. General Account: beginning balance \$1,470.65; expenditures \$1,605.43; deposits \$845.00; Transfer from Truman Carter Account \$4,000.00; interest \$0.02; ending balance \$4,710.24. Bob Nicholson and Jim Carman reviewed the bank statement and approved all transactions.

Ed made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Tim seconded the motion. The motion carried. The meeting adjourned 7:47 p.m.

## 2015 March of Dimes Silver Dollar

The Mint creates two commemorative coins a year to raise money to support worthy organizations. Congress decides which organizations will benefit from commemorative coins and passes laws that tell the Mint which coins to create.

With its March of Dimes silver dollar, the U.S. Mint celebrates an organization that has been helping kids stay healthy for 75 years. It began with a lot of volunteers collecting money to stop a deadly disease. Today, its research helps babies arrive healthy and strong.

On Dec. 18, 2012, Congress signed the March of Dimes Commemorative Coin Act to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the March of Dimes Foundation. Money from sales go to help finance research, education and services to improve the health of women, infants and children.

The coin's design represents the March of Dimes foundation's past, present and future and its role as a champion for improving the health of mothers and babies.



The obverse design shows President Franklin D. Roosevelt in the foreground and Dr. Jonas Salk, two leaders in the fight to end polio.

The reverse design shows a parent's hand holding a baby to represent the mission to ensure healthy moms and babies.
