“No,” admitted the other. “Ran over me a half hour ago.”




Judy brought up stamp advertising. One of the dealers has asked if we would advertise our show in one of the stamp magazines. Judy will advertise in one of the stamp magazines.

Judy received an ANA participation medal in appreciation for participation. This was donated by Harry.



## Coin of the Month

# John F. Kennedy Presidential Dollar



*The obverse design features President Kennedy's portrait. The reverse features the Statue of Liberty.*

President Kennedy was the youngest man ever elected as a U.S. president. A U.S. Navy lieutenant, war hero, scholar and writer, he made his mark on history by streamlining economic reforms and championing the civil rights movement.

Kennedy joined the Navy. During World War II, he led his crew of 12 to safety in a battle against Japanese ships and was later awarded a Navy and Marine Corps Medal and a Purple Heart for his leadership and courage.

Following his military service, Kennedy briefly worked as a reporter before becoming a congressman in 1946. In 1953 after being elected senator, Kennedy married Jacqueline Bouvier.

Kennedy was in office for fewer than three years when an assassin killed him on Nov. 22, 1963. A scholar and advocate for social justice, Kennedy left a legacy for many generations to come

Here are some highlights of his presidency:

- The 1961 launch of the first American manned spaceflight, Freedom 7.
- The successful resolution of the Cuban Missile Crisis.
- Establishment of the U.S. Peace Corps, an organization that celebrated more than 50 years of service in 140 countries as of 2011.
