The Great American Coin Hunt

As I was surfing Facebook the other day, a post from the ANA caught my eye. The post was on the Great American Coin Hunt. I know what the Great American Race and the Great Relative Race are. But I had never heard of this coin hunt, so I read the post.

The hunt is being held in conjunction with National Coin week. This is how it works: collectors and dealers are urged to release one million vintage and rare coins back into circulation between April 21 and April 27, 2019. The goal is to draw new people to the hobby of coin collecting.

The article indicated some of the planned items to drop into circulation range from Buffalo nickels, Ike dollars and Wheat cents to Silver Certificates, five and 10 dollar – blue and red seals.

The article included a map that indicated which cities the item drops were going to occur in. It looks like Kansas City, Saint Louis and Tulsa are going to get in on the action. Keep your eyes peeled as some of those items might make their way here! And if they do, we want to hear about your find!

Coin of the Month

American Legion 100th Anniversary Commemorative

The American Legion was founded on March 15, 1919 in Paris out of concern for the welfare of U.S. soldiers after they returned home to World War I. Today, the American Legion is the nation's largest veterans group, with nearly two million members in more than 12,000 posts throughout the United States.

This commemorative has three versions. The obverses are shown on the right.

Gold: The design commemorates the founding of the American Legion and its mission to serve America and its war veterans. The outer geometric rim from the American Legion emblem, the Eiffel Tower, and the letter "V" for victory represent the formation of the organization in Paris in 1919 at the end of World War I.

Silver: Depicts the American Legion emblem adorned by oak leaves and a lily, commemorating the founding of the American Legion in Paris, France.

Clad: Features two children standing and reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. The little girl proudly wears her grandfather's old American Legion hat.
