### **The Year 1982:**

This was the YN program for the April meeting. These are numismatic events that happened in 1982.

- The first modern commemorative was minted. A half dollar commemorating the 250th anniversary of Geo. Washington birth.
- The mint stopped striking the SBA dollar after three years (1979-1981). Minted the SBA dollar one last time in 1999.
- The discovery of the no "P" Roosevelt dime on circulating strikes. These dimes were found mostly in northern Ohio.
- There were no uncirculated mint sets issued from either Denver or Philadelphia in 1982 or 1983. Souvenir sets were issued from both mints in specially packaged envelopes and sold only at mint gift shops.

# **American Innovation \$1 Coin - Maryland**

In 1990, NASA launched the Hubble Space Telescope. It is one of the largest and most versatile space telescopes. Teams at NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center and the Space Telescope Science Institute manage the telescope. The teams are in Maryland.

The Hubble Telescope flies around, or orbits, high above Earth and its atmosphere. This provides for a better view of space than telescopes from on Earth. Hubble takes pictures of space and uses radio waves to send them through air back to Earth. Scientists use these pictures to learn about the universe.

Hubble helped scientists estimate the age of the universe – almost 14 billion years old! Hubble ob-

serves comets and planets. It even discovered new moons around Pluto. It helps scientists understand how planets and galaxies form. It has also spots black holes and observes the birth and death of stars.

Did you know the Hubble Space Telescope was named after Edwin Hubble, an astronomer? Or that Edwin Hubble was born in Marshfield, MO?
