
OCC ANNUAL PICNIC

Coin of the Month

2021 Washington Crossing the Delaware Quarter

In 2021, the U.S. Mint began minting and issuing quarters with a reverse design depicting General George Washington crossing the Delaware River prior to the Battle of Trenton during the American Revolutionary War. On December 25, 1776, General George Washington, along with 2,400 troops and artillery, began his historic crossing of the Delaware River in preparation for a surprise attack on British and Hessian soldiers.

In accordance with the authorizing legislation, the obverse of the quarter will revert to renowned designer John Flanagan's design featuring President Washington that

appeared on the coin before the 50 State Quarters Program.

This the second quarter dollar to be released in 2021, after the final issue of 56 coins in the America the Beautiful Quarters Program - the 2021 Tuskegee Airmen National Historic Site quarter dollar - was released Jan. 4.

This quarter is a one-year issue, to be replaced in 2022 when the U.S. Mint begins a new circulating quarter dollar program to run through 2025 with reverse designs dedicated to historic American women.

Obverse: George Washington's image used on the quarter since 1932. The style of the design and the inscriptions return to how they appeared on the quarter before the 50 State Quarters Program began in 1999.
