### American Innovation™ \$1 Coin – Massachusetts

In 1876, Alexander Graham Bell changed communication forever. He received a patent for an invention that transmitted the human voice: the telephone.

On March 10, 1876, Bell made the first-ever phone call from his lab in Boston, Massachusetts. He called his assistant, Thomas Watson, in the next room. Bell said, “Mr. Watson – come here – I want to see you.”

The impact of Bell’s invention is still felt today.

#### **Coin Description:**

Reverse: Shows the dial of an old rotary dial telephone.

Obverse: Features the Statue of Liberty.

On a side note: How many of us ‘old people’ remember using a phone that looks like this one in our ‘youth’? Boy, do I remember using a phone that looks like this one!
