Coin of the Month

American Innovation™ \$1 Coin – New Jersey

The electric light bulb was first invented in the 1830s. But these early versions had short lifespans, used too much energy, or were too expensive to make. It wasn't until many years later that Thomas Edison and his team located in Menlo Park, New Jersey, began to work on ways to improve the light bulb.

First, they worked on the filament. A filament is the wire inside the bulb that lights up when you turn it on. By 1879, Edison and his team invented a filament that could last 14.5 hours. Then, they made one that lasted 1,200 hours! They also developed a better vacuum pump to remove air from the bulb. And they created the Edison screw, the standard light bulb socket used today. As a result, light bulbs began to be produced in large amounts and available to the public.

The invention of a widely-available light bulb changed and improved society. It gave people control over light in homes and businesses, changing the way we live and work. With electric lighting came networks of wires, making it easy to add household appliances and other machines. Without the light bulb we wouldn't have most of the electric appliances we use today.
