
ST. CHARLES BUS TRIP




Remember that the club will pay for the YN's dinner at MO Hick BBQ in Cuba and give them \$20 spend while at the show!

National Coin Week Comes to Mt. Vernon, MO

Picture this: It is National Coin Week and you want to do some youth outreach and share coins and collecting with children. What do you do? Well, you do what our Vice-President did and contact your former math teacher turned children's librarian and ask if you can do a program for two groups of home school students. That's right, Dyan E and her son, Dillon, shared their knowledge of numismatics and coin collecting with 23 homeschoolers at the Mount Vernon, MO library on April 20, 2022. The youth ranged from 1st grade through 5th grade in one group and 6th through 12th grade in another.

Both groups watched a power point about the history of coins and collecting. Both groups watched videos on the mint that were found on the US Mint for Kids website. In both groups, a drawing was held and someone in each group left with a Whitman folder for the new Women's Quarter series with a Washington Crossing the Delaware quarter in it. The younger class did a coin rubbing activity, a design your own coin activity and learned about starting and storing a collection. The older class watched a short video on coin designers and then did a coin scavenger hunt and a spot the differences worksheet for Missouri's America the Beautiful quarter. They took home the design your own coin activity. We gave the older children foreign coins to kick start their collection.

The kids seemed to love it and are still talking about it. Ms. Cindy at the library sent us a nice thank you note that needs to be shared with the club. Cindy wrote "...The children really enjoyed it – as did I!- and learned a lot of valuable information..."

Without Betty G's loan of red books and other numismatic related books, this program would not have gone as smoothly as it did. THANK YOU, BETTY G.
