FOR OUR VETERANS

I wanted to do an edition of "If Coins Could Talk..." for Veterans Day. But unexpected space limitations did not allow for that. While I'm saddened we're missing out on the stories the guest could tell, I wanted to recognize the veterans in our club from all the wars. In particular, I wanted to give a shout out to the ones in my family: cousins, grandparents, uncles and my father. My family had 3 in Vietnam, so the Vietnam Veterans Memorial commemorative holds a special place for me. There is a popular hair band from the 1990s that has a song with the lyrics "...in a time I don't remember and in a war he can't forget..." Unfortunately this is very true for veterans of many wars, not just Vietnam, and their families, especially mine.

The Vietnam Veterans commemorative came out in 1994 and was to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in DC. The design features the hand of a veteran pressed against the names of those with whom he served. The National Monument stands in the background. The reverse depicts the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. It's a touching tribute, and a personal favorite of obverse designer and former U.S. Mint Chief Engraver John Mercanti.

Coin of the Month

Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park Quarter

The Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park in Vermont is the only national park dedicated to conservation. Conservation is the care and protection of natural resources for future use.

The park was the home of George Perkins Marsh, who was one of America's first conservationists. Later, the park was the home of Frederick Billings, who was also a famous conservationist.

The most recent owners, Laurance S. and Mary F. Rockefeller gave the land to the American public.

In 1992, the land became a national park, dedicated to conservation.

Reverse

Shows a young girl planting a Norway spruce seedling near an established tree, continuing the life cycle of the forest.

Obverse

Features the portrait of George Washington by John Flanagan, used on the quarter-dollar coin since 1932.
