COIN OF THE MONTH

2008 Bald Eagle Commemorative Half Dollar

This coin celebrates an American success story: the bald eagle. The American Bald Eagle Recovery and National Emblem Commemorative Coin Act was passed by Congress to recognize the eagle, its importance as a national symbol, and its return from near extinction in the lower 48 states. Congress passed the Act unanimously before it was signed by the President. The series celebrates the eagle's recovery as well as the 35th anniversary of the Endangered Species Act of 1973, which has helped in the recovery.



This once-endangered species, unique to North America, is now making a gradual comeback. Classified as "endangered" in 1973 under the Endangered Species Act, this eagle was later moved to the less endangered "threatened" list thanks to the law and to caring people and organizations.

The bald eagle was removed from the "threatened species" list in 2007, but wildlife agencies continued to keep an eye on the eagle. Part of the surcharge on the bald eagle coins was used to fund this work.
