First Spouse Coin Trivia Answers

In last month's YN-SIDER, the YNs were asked to name six presidents who did not have a spouse on their first spouse coin. I have to apologize; I made a mistake last month when I said there were 6 presidents without a first spouse on their coin. There were only **FIVE** presidents, not six. I hope that didn't throw too many off!

Here are the answers and what is on their first spouse coin:

1. Thomas Jefferson: He was widowed in 1782. His First Spouse coin has Liberty from the Draped Bust Half-Cent coin from 1800-1808 on the obverse. The reverse has the monument from his final resting place at Monticello
2. Andrew Jackson: He was widowed in 1828. His First Spouse coin has Liberty from the Capped Bust, Lettered Edge Half Dollar coin from 1807-1836 on the obverse. The reverse has an image showing "Old Hickory" with his troops at the Battle of New Orleans.
3. Martin Van Buren: He was widowed in 1819. His First Spouse coin has Liberty from the Liberty Seated Dime coin from 1837-1891. The reverse has a scene from his youth showing him being exposed to politics.
4. James Buchanan: He was never married. His First Spouse coin has Liberty from the Liberty Head Quarter Eagle from 1840-1907. The reverse of his coin is an image of him as a boy working in his family's country store.
5. Chester Arthur: He was widowed before becoming president. His First Spouse coin has a likeness of Alice Paul on the obverse. On the reverse, there is an image representing the suffrage movement. Alice Paul was a leading suffragist and was instrumental in the passage of the 19th amendment. She was born during Chester Arthur's presidency.

Note: The law that authorized the First Spouse coin program, determined that the presidents without a first spouse would have a version of Liberty on their obverse. The Liberty chosen was one minted during their presidency. Chester Arthur was the exception. The law specifically stated that Alice Paul would be on President Arthur's First Spouse coin. Even though women gained the right to vote during President Wilson's term, President Arthur's coin bears the suffragist leader and image.
