

Parts of a Coin



Across

A portrait on a coin, usually including the head, neck and upper shoulders.

The back side of a coin.

7. Opposite of incuse, the part of a coin's design. that is raised above the surface.

9. The artist who creates a coin's design.

11. The portion of a coin's surface not used for the design or inscription.

Down

1. The legend or lettering on a coin.

2. The front side of a coin. It usually has the date, mint mark and main design.

5. A small letter on a coin identifying which mint struck the coin.

6. The year a coin is minted.

8. The raised edge on both sides of a coin that helps protect the coin's design from wear.

 The outer border of a coin, considered the "third side".
